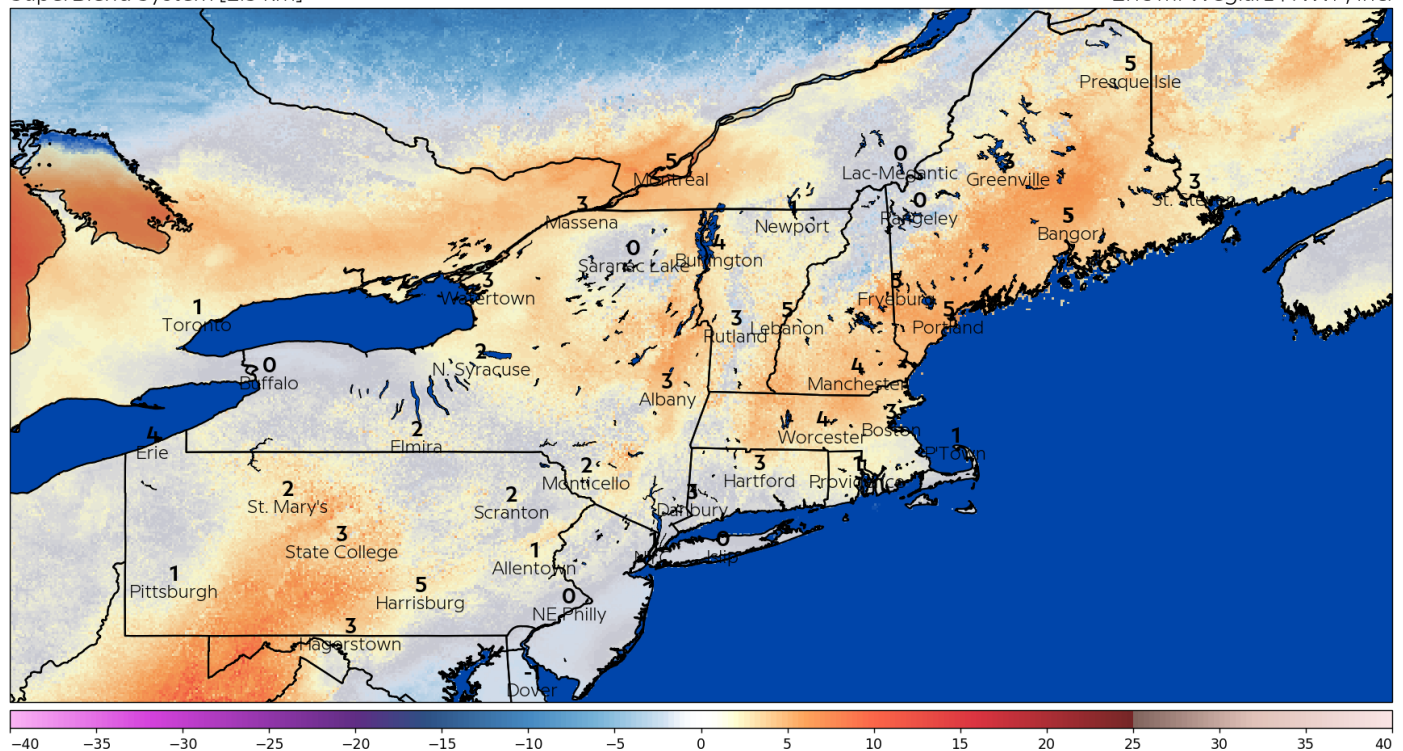
Key Take-Aways next ten days:

- A break in the cold
- Only minor storm system in the pipeline for now
- Warmer than normal conditions develop over the next few days
- Backdoor Arctic front over north – some colder air Northern Maine tomorrow
- A cool down indicated for next week
- Frigid weather likely to return by mid-February

Discussion: While the Arctic air retreats, we see a milder pattern developing across the Northeast – starting today. See expected afternoon high temperature anomalies below:

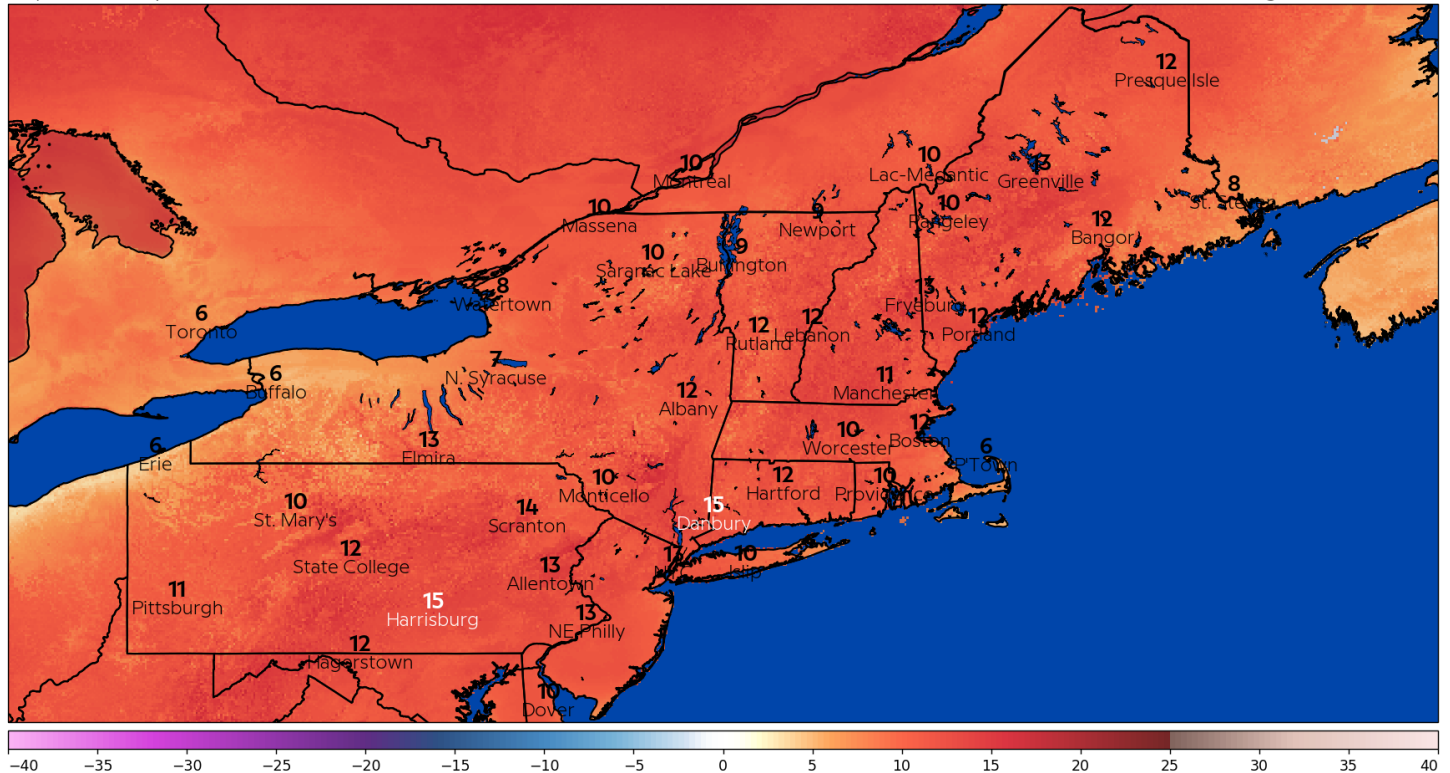
Above – High temperature anomalies for today – Monday, January 22

As the warm-up gets underway, a series of relatively weather low pressure systems will impact the Northeast and we expect to see some light precipitation developing later tomorrow and Wednesday – falling as some snow across northern areas and mostly rain across Southern New England and points south. We do not expect any significant amounts of snow or rain this week.

Late this week, a slightly stronger storm may bring some steadier precipitation to the region – which may fall as some snow across northern areas of New England – but mostly rain is expected elsewhere. After that system passes, we'll enjoy a mild start to the weekend before some cooler air starts to filter in. High temperature anomalies for next Saturday will be some 10-15 degrees warmer than normal in most areas (see graphic below):

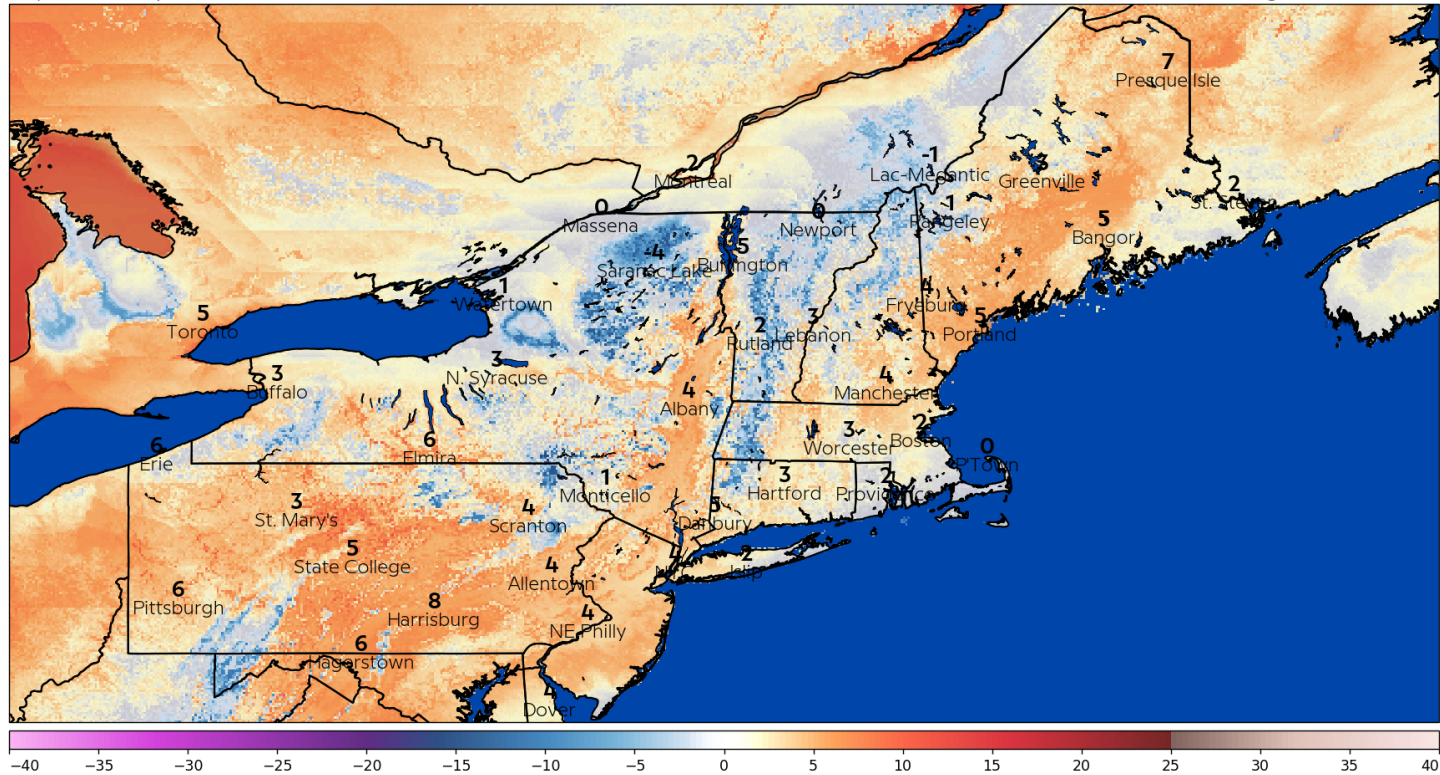

Longer range thoughts: Seasonably warm weather is expected to persist through early February before the cold reloads and returns after February 10th. We expect some cold weather for the middle of February and there's a good chance that below normal temperatures will persist through the end of February – and quite possibly into March.
